White Poppies for Peace - White poppies are available in the narthex for those who would like to wear one alongside the red poppy. White poppies were first worn in 1933 by women of the Cooperative Women's Guild many of whom had lost loved ones in the First World War, they wanted to hold on to the key message of Remembrance Day, 'Never Again' They stand for three things.
